RULES:

- Deadline for application (with fee) is June 18, 2013. Use the enclosed registration form and complete the competition section on page 10.
- All music must be memorized and an original copy provided for the judge(s); no photocopies allowed.
- Winners will be selected based on an audition before judges. Criteria include technical fluency, accuracy, musical interpretation and style.
- If only one contestant applies in a category or if there is not a qualified contestant, the judge(s) may decide not to select a winner.
- The judge(s)' decision is final.
- Winners will be required to participate in a recital on Friday, July 12.
